\*\*\*\*For the House, Labor HHS does not include the \$1.9 billion that has been set aside for emergency home energy assistance in the event that the President's proposal to turn LIHEAP funding into mandatory spending does not pass. The Labor HHS figure for the Senate does include this amount. If the \$1.9 billion is included, the House proposal for Labor HHS exceeds the Senate proposal by \$300,000,000.
